extremely grateful for your support.




Please inform Gail of members who may be ill, hospitalized, suffering a loss or dealing with other life issues so that she can send cards and encouragement from the Club.



We are looking forward to our next venue on January 14th - Renninger's Antique Center in Mount Dora!





This group has six couples and is at capacity.


