Along with the many sorrows this past year, have come many joys. While we mourn the loss of longtime Women’s Club Members, the support I have witnessed for each other has been truly inspiring. Please take a moment to remember them – Frances Millican, Martha Goree, Judith Beale, Jane Denning, Sheila Somerville, Jo Dutton and Laura Klee. Remember the impact they made on your life and the impact they made on the UCF Women’s Club. The best way we can honor their memory is to continue the good work they started.

What have we done this past year? We had Session II of the Oyster Reef Restoration Project and made another 150 mats, bringing our total mat making efforts to 350! It was a lively bunch who met in a classroom in the Biology Building. The UCF Women’s Club joined forces with Lee Kernek, Associate VP of Administration and Finance and Montel Watson, Director, Facilities Operations, Physical Plant (look for Montel in our “Kudos Section!”). Family members were dragged – oops, I mean came willingly – along to help. We had students from UCF and also from some local high

schools. Several of the high school students received community service credit for their efforts. Thanks to all who participated! It really was a terrific project.

We had an amazing beach weekend (June 5/6) to lay the mats and dedicate the reef to our Frances. We laid the mats at Canaveral Shores, New Smyrna Beach area. We broke the project World Record for reef mats laid in one session! We also had a great dinner on Saturday at Norwood’s to toast the project success, dedicate the reef to Frances and help Dick and Bev Tucker celebrate their 50th Wedding Anniversary. It is a lovely website and I would like to thank Jen Rupert and the College of Sciences Web and Graphics team for their efforts. They did an incredible job. We will be tweaking as we go along but my hope is that you will refer to the site and use it more and more to get information on what is happening with the UCFWC. We are desperately trying to utilize less paper and more technology. You can do it!

I hope you all have a fun summer, enjoy your travels and join this wonderful group for another year of friendship and achievement.

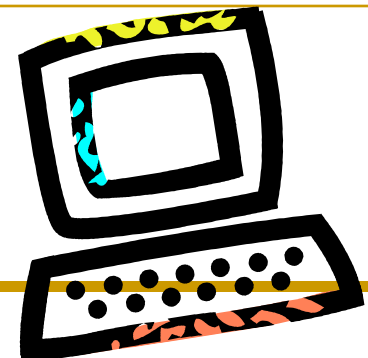

Evening Bookworms

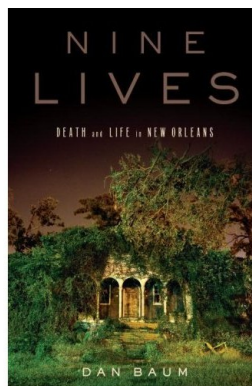

In Memory of Martha Goree

Martha Nobles Brewer Goree died Tuesday, February 9, 2010. She was born February 17, 1928 in Orlando, Florida. She graduated Ft. Pierce High School in 1946, and Florida Southern College in 1950. She taught elementary school in McClenney, Kissimmee, and Ft. Pierce, Florida before her marriage in 1952. She was co-founder and director of the Early Childhood Center (ECC) of the Oviedo, Florida, United Methodist Church, and one of the founders of the University of Central Florida Women's Club. She was a member of Chapter GL of the PEO Benevolent Sorority, and Delta Delta Delta Sorority. Martha is survived by the love of her life, her best friend, and constant caregiver throughout her illness, her husband John Philip Goree Sr., "Phil". It's hard to even imagine sitting around Martha's dining room table planning the scholarships for the UCF Women's Club 40 years ago - but it's where it all began. She had confidence in me and all of the Presidents and Board Members who have gone before to continue the good stewardship

of a club that was near and dear to her heart. I never wanted to let her down. I can only imagine those of you whose lives she touched, felt the same way. She truly encouraged us all to give of our best to the University of Central Florida. I know that's exactly what she did – she gave her best to this university. Wasn't it touching to listen to Charlie Millican speak from his heart about what she meant to him and how much she had contributed to the development of this university? She could have so easily retired quietly but Frances continued to be an ambassador and advocate for UCF - involved in so many ways to the very end. That kind of dedication is truly rare.
