The Searchers

Have you been told your great-great grandmother was a Cherokee princess or that you were related to George Washington? Would you like to learn the truth, build your family tree? Find your Revolutionary War veteran or find your Italian ancestors? If so, become a member of The Searchers, the genealogy group of the Women's Club at UCF.


The Searchers is the newest Interest Group of our club led by Dr. Beth Barnes. The Searchers was formed this summer by a group of 16 women eager to trace their ancestors, prove their relationship to royalty, or find the black sheep in the family.

During the first two meetings held via Zoom, we discussed our experience with genealogical sleuthing and our goals and difficulties with research thus far. Some of us have already made some pretty exciting discoveries as seen in copy of document to the right — Dr. Barnes' great aunt, Selma Martha Maxville, was an American missionary murdered by kidnappers in Burma. Others of us have found that we are stuck on a particular problem and need each others help.

We have spent time on some of the basic methods of research and on the sources we might want to use to set up our family trees, including Ancestry.com and familysearch.com. We also began reading together The Unofficial Guide to Ancestry.com. We will continue these monthly discussions as we progress in our research.

In future meetings, we hope to invite one of the genealogists from the Orange County Library System to speak to us and to visit the genealogy collection at the West Oaks Branch Library, the largest in the southeast. Our meetings will also address such topics as standards of proof and research in vital records, military records, census reports, church records, non-U.S. records, etc.

Interest Group News.....Daytime Bookworms



Tech Curious: Cutting The Cord and Cable

One of the best Tech Curious sessions we ever had was the one on "Cutting the Cable". Here is a replay summary you may enjoy reading.

Are you paying too much for cable service? So you know what your alternatives are? These questions and more were covered in a recent Tech Curious session. Here are the highlights on what you need to know to "cut the cable" and lower your cable costs.

First, you need to ask yourself the following questions:

- * Do you have a Smart TV? If so, you already have access to most streaming services like Netflix or Amazon Prime.
- * Do you have any subscriptions for special movie channels?
- * How much is your cable TV portion now and what plan are you on? You need to determine how much you would need to pay for services that you now get from the cable company such as HBO, Showtime, Netflix, Hulu, Amazon Prime, Disney Plus, etc.
- * How much are you paying for the internet connection? You will need a connection to streaming services.
- * What standard live channels are your favorites? What can't you live without?
- * What are your favorite shows that you don't want to lose? Any special sporting events or channels that are favorites? Are you willing to be flexible? This will not be the same experience as cable, working with new technology/new apps and without standard live cable TV channels – like CBS, NBC, ABC.
- * Which streaming content services do you now have? Netflix, Hulu, Amazon Prime, PBS Passport? How much are you paying for those and are other family members sharing them?
- * How much recording via DVR do you do on a regular basis?
- * Are you just tired of cable? Want fewer ads, set up TVs anywhere in the house, and avoid rate hikes. Do you have more channels than you need or want?

With those answers you are ready to determine if cutting out the cable TV portion of your bill makes sense based on how much you will save.

Next review what you will need to get started:

- You will need a smart TV which start at about \$150 OR you will need a streaming device such as Roku's Streaming Stick (about \$50) or Amazon's Fire TV Stick (about \$35).
- You will also need to add some of the streaming services mentioned above that you now have.
- If you want to watch the regular programming of standard broadcast channel such as ABC, CBS, NBC then you will need an antenna which will cost between \$20 and \$100.
